Reminder: Division of Taxation is open on Monday *Tax forms and instructions remain available online around the clock*

PROVIDENCE, R.I. – The Rhode Island Division of Taxation reminds taxpayers and tax preparers that the Division will be open on Monday, February 17, 2020.

Monday is a federal holiday.¹ Nevertheless, the Rhode Island Division of Taxation will be open to the public on Monday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Because it will be a three-day weekend for some people, it will be one of the busiest tax-filing weekends of the season. The Division reminds taxpayers and tax preparers that Rhode Island personal income tax forms, instructions, and related schedules and other materials are available for download any time [online at the Division of Taxation website](#). For help with your personal income tax questions, call (401) 574-8829 (choose option # 3) or visit the Division's office on the first floor of the Powers Building, at One Capitol Hill, diagonally across from the Smith Street entrance of the State House. However, please keep in mind that, because it is tax-filing season, the Division will be receiving a high volume of phone calls, emails, and visitors.
